Bourne	Wall	Stone inscription	In memory of Norman Harold Bourne DSO 18 th Dec 1914 – 20 th Mar 1970 Who served this village for many years and was greatly loved. Dear husband of Frances.
Corke	Near pulpit	Wall plaque	In loving memory of Anthony Peter Corke of this parish killed while flying 18 July 1950 Aged 22 Per adua ad astra
Day	Back wall	Stone inscription	In loving memory of Petty Officer Peter Joseph Day RN of HMS Nelson the only son of Alfred and Sarah Day of this parish who died at sea as a result of an accident Feb 27 1930 and was buried at Malta aged thirty eight years. <i>Census information/ parish records: Peter Joseph was also brother to Louisa, Kate, Mabel Beatrice (m. Percy William Lambert (24), son of farmer Albert Lambert, on 8 Apr 1912), Margaret Gertrude (m. Charles Edward Swinyard (32), son of labourer Edward George Swinyard, on 9 Oct 1919) and Georgina Clara (m. widower Albert Illing (37), son of labourer Arthur Illing, on 22 Oct 1922).</i> <i>Alfred, "sexton and clerk for 48 years" died in 1933 (buried 12 June) at the age of 68 yrs and Sarah (nee Elliott) of 'Lamp Cottage' in the village died not long afterwards (buried 23 October 1933) at the age of 66 yrs.</i> <i>Alfred and Sarah are buried in the church graveyard in School Lane, East Clandon.</i>

MDCCCC <i>Frank Bruce Eastwood (see 'Keswick') dedicated this in 1900 to the memory of his father.</i> <i>Census information (1871/91): John Fisher Eastwood of Esher Lodge- brick merchant, dividend holder, landowner, JP and High Sheriff, Surrey.</i>

Fisher	Near vestry	Wall plaque	In proud and loving memory of our son Edward Walter Fisher 2 nd Batt. Hon. Artl. Co. killed in action in the Asiago district Italy 30 June 1918 Aged 33 years. He fought, endured and died.

Hebeler	Beneath stained glass window nr. vestry	Plaque	This window is erected to the Glory of God and in proud and grateful memory of my husband Roland Stuart Hebeler Captain 7 th Battalion the Queens – who gave his life for his King and Country on the 16 th day of September 1915 at Corbie in France – aged 44... “How sweet to live – magnificent to die”

Keswick	Altar	Wall plaque	In loving memory of David Johnstone Keswick Lieutenant X11 Royal Lancers who was killed in battle at Poplar Grove in the Orange Free State on the 7 th of March MDCCC aged 23. These windows are dedicated by his sister Amy Sophie Eastwood. The eternal God is thy refuge. <i>Census information: David b.1877 in Japan, was the son of William Keswick, magistrate and china merchant, of Eastwick Park, Gt. Bookham. In 1895, Amy Sophie married Frank Bruce Eastwood, “Colonial produce broker” and lived at High Clandon in the village.</i>

Lang	Choir stalls	Stone inscription	To the blessed memory of Lilian, a devoted servant of the church who entered unto rest 18 th July 1963. The beloved wife of Frederick John Lang.
Longstreth	Window	Stained glass	To thee our parents Emily Burling Longstreth and John Hunt Longstreth who lie buried at the Woodlands Philadelphia USA. This window is erected with undying devotion by thy daughters Anne Richardson and Rachel Holme Sumner. “The Kingdom of Heaven is within us” They lived, gloried and died in the Quaker strongholds.
Nicholas	Wall	Stone monument	Near this place are interred the remains of Lucy Elizabeth Nicholas, daughter of Nicholas and Mary Nicholas and grand-daughter of Richard Heath formerly of Hatchlands in this Parish, who died 22 nd of February 1779 Aged 7 yrs ‘Here rests the fairest Bud of Hope That e’er to mortal wish was given If thou would’st know its happier state Repent and seek the Flower in Heaven’ In this vault are deposited the remains of Sir Richard Heath, Knt. And Lady Heath and also of Sir Thomas Heath, Knt. and Bridget his Lady, successively possessors of Hatchlands

Rendel	Side chapel	Tomb	<p>Here rest the remains of Stuart Baron Rendel of Hatchlands Officer of the Order of the Crown of Italy, Knight of the Order of Charles XII of Spain and President of the University College of Wales. He was born on the second day of July in the year MDCCCXXXIV* and died on the fourth day of June in the year MDCDXIII** (* 1834 ** 1913)</p> <p>Here also rest the remains of Ellen Sophy, his wife, daughter of William Egerton Hubbard esquire of Leonardslee in the county of Sussex. She was born on the twentieth day of February in the year MDCCCXXXVIII* and died on the twentieth day of May in the year MDCDXII** (*1838 **1912)</p> <p>Grant them O Lord eternal rest and let light perpetual shine upon them. Sumner	Altar wall	Stone monument	Near this monument are interred the remains of Mrs Catharine Sumner, daughter of John Holme Esq. of Holme Hill in the county of Cumberland & wife of William Brightwell Sumner Esq. of Hatchlands Place in this parish. Those exemplary virtues which as a daughter, wife, parent and friend distinguished and endeared her living are worthy of remembrance and imitation. She died the 30 th Dec 1777 Aged 41
Sumner	Altar wall	Stone inscription	Sacred to the memory of George Holme Sumner Esq. (of Hatchlands in this parish) born November 10 th 1760, died June 9 th 1838 Colonel of 1 st Regt. Of Royal Surrey Militia & represented the county of Surrey 32 yrs in Parliament. Also in memory of Louisa, his wife, who died 14 th of April 1816
Sumner	Altar/Choir stalls area	Stone inscription	In memory of William Holme Sumner Esq. (of Hatchlands in this parish) Colonel of the 1 st Regiment, Royal Surrey Militia born 19 th August 1798 died 10 th September 1859. "The memory of the just is blessed" PROV.X c.7 v.
Sumner (see also 'Longstreth')	Windows	Stained glass	To the sacred memory of Catherine and William Brightwell Sumner Louisa Louisa Maria George William and Mary Barnard Holme-Sumner who lie beneath this church and of Arthur Holme Sumner who is buried at Malta. This window is erected by Frank Holme Sumner W.M Hatchlands Lodge No.2756 A.D. 1901
