

Message from your Rector

Welcome to the beautiful village of East Clandon, where I am sure you will be very happy.

The church of St Thomas of Canterbury is central to the community both geographically and historically. It has stood at the heart of the village for almost a thousand years. It was originally built by the monks of Chertsey Abbey and used by them for worship for many years. The church remains a central part of village life and many villagers take an active interest in its preservation.

Please do take the opportunity to visit the church. It is unlocked during daylight hours. It is a beautifully peaceful place, and might provide something of a refuge amid the chaos of moving house!

Our church services are at 9.15am on the first, third and fifth Sundays of the month, where we celebrate Holy Communion. On the second Sunday of the month there is a joint service of Morning Worship in East Clandon at 10.30am. This service has a Sunday Club for children of all ages which meets in the village hall where children can learn something about the Christian faith and enjoy some fun crafts. On the fourth Sunday of the month there is no service in East Clandon church, but there is a joint service of Morning worship at St Peter and St Paul West Clandon, which also has a Sunday Club. You would be very warmly welcomed at any of our church services.

The church is available for baptisms, weddings and funeral. Please contact me with any enquiries about these services, or if you would like me to pay you a visit.
