**Other Areas**

Location	2	<b>Ripley Road verge</b> - should be left to grow naturally throughout the year, optionally with a tidy 1 metre wide cut adjacent to the road if appropriate.
Location	7	<b>The Street hedgerow and Hatchlands access</b> - managed by the National Trust, this hedgerow is occasionally cut and notably the cuttings left in the field margin to provide shelter and decompose over time. They are not burned.
Location	8	<b>New Road verge</b> - managed by the National Trust this verge under the Walnuts trees is left unmanaged.
Location	11	<b>Old Epsom Road southern hedgerow and verges.</b> Since the erection of the sound proofing fencing along this border, there is a shady, sheltered and protected (but not quiet) area where plants can thrive and unknown creatures can hide. However, much of this area STILL contains a large amount of litter and rubbish that precedes the fencing. Once cleared up, this area would not revert to the same level of litter and would be relatively clean and wildlife friendly again. PC are encouraged to direct resources to properly clearing up this litter once and for all.
Location	12	<b>Old Epsom Road northern hedgerow and verges.</b> It is recommended to leave the mature Hawthorn hedges uncut and the verges to grown naturally apart from a 1 metre wide 'grass' cut adjacent to the pavement and an access path to the telephone exchange box. As with the southern border, there is a good deal of 'deep-seated' litter still in this hedgerow that has been there for years and should be removed in winter when the vegetation is at its thinnest
