1715 **Tunmore Fields**

For the benefit of the members of the public present, Adrian gave a concise outline of the history and present use of the fields (which are registered as a Village Green), and the concerns of the parish council for future use so that the terms of the restrictive covenants can be properly observed. He listed the suggestions which the council has received for its use by the village. Following discussion, it was decided that the parish council continue with its plans for the improvement of the fields with a view to more profitable letting of the pasture as grazing for horses. The council will be careful that the contract for grazing allows for the possibility of public use of the fields on limited occasions, eg for the annual fete. It is estimated that after 18 months of full letting for grazing the outlay involved in pasture improvement, new fencing and gate, etc, would be covered. All profits then to be used for the village. The council was asked to investigate the possibility/practicality of planting of

fruit trees in the fields or their hedges, for which there was general support.

- a. Neighbourhood Watch. Ray brought the attention of the meeting to the excellent Neighbourhood Watch circular, received through the village email.
- b. Circulation of documents. Mary asked councillors to inform her when they plan to be out of the village, so that documents to be circulated can be seen by all councillors as quickly as possibly, especially in the case of planning applications.
- c. Sibylla asked if any future donations could include installation costs as well as the purchase price.
- d. Elections. It was noted that elections are scheduled for May 2007 and

- nomination forms are currently being submitted, with four nominees for five vacancies. Simon Wood (member of public in attendance) voiced his interest in becoming a Councillor, and was provided with the necessary nomination papers.
- e. <u>Snelgate verges</u>. Anne Randall repeated her earlier requests that the verges between New Manor Farm and Snelgate be cleared. The Community Gang had been asked to include this on their work lists but have not yet done so. These verges are now very untidy. Ann also pointed out that when the road sweeper comes, he goes no further than New Manor Farm before turning round.
