### **Playground**

a. <u>RoSPA Report</u>. The report found nothing more serious than the category of "medium risk" which will be covered by routine maintenance through the year.

b. <u>Upgrading of playground</u>. A suggestion has been made by a member of the village who would like to see the playground upgraded more in line with other villages. It was agreed that the parish council does not at present have funds available to contemplate such a project. Cherry Trees, whose children use the playground most, would need to be involved in any future consultation.

#### Log burning

The policy of the parish council is to burn logs only when necessary. Generally logs are piled up to decompose naturally and to provide a wildlife haven.

### **Tunmore Fields Update.**

The project is now complete. A letter will be sent to Sally Grahame in response to her concerns over access to the fields.

It was decided that we need an imminent commitment from Mike Cook over his policy to spray the fields now, or to top them.

There is a large sycamore tree overhanging the Sawpit Lane side of the fields which may need attention soon.

## **Star Energy Gas Pipeline**

The need to share all information with neighbouring parishes was discussed, but it was agreed that any letters of objection should be sent separately in order to maximise effect. Star Energy has offered another meeting to address the failed questions left over from the open meeting held in our parish hall. The council working party group consists of Ray, Paul and Simon who will arrange the meeting with Star Energy as soon as possible, the village will be kept informed by our email system.

Cllr David Davis recommended contact with the Blackheath Group, who have a very organised website – he will provide Mary with the address.

The councillors accepted their tasks of annual/biennial risk assessment. Paul will provide them with report sheets.
