Minutes of the meeting of 18th October 2007

The Minutes were signed by the Chairman as correct.

Matters arising

a. <u>Item 1760c. village benches</u>. The order for a 'Mickleham' style bench has been made with Norbury Wood Products, and the sum of £123.38 paid as deposit.

b. <u>Item 1760d Verge alongside the Old Epsom Road-Snelgate</u>. The manager of Ryde Farm Estates (Chris Chambers) is not at present able to assist in the cutting back of this hedge, although, in principle, he is willing to help with it early in 2008. In the meantime, Simon, assisted by other councillors will begin work on it. There is the possibility of the loan of a tractor and flail cutter. Once clear of excess growth, it should be possible for Jim Bacon to maintain it.

Overgrown hedgerow between rear of Snelgate properties and the golf course. The golf course maintenance staff have now done this work, very satisfactorily.

c. <u>item 1760e. Pipeline</u>. No further information. Paul has not yet been able to contact anybody at the National Trust with the correct authority to respond.

d. <u>Item 1760g. Hatchlands/New Road verge annual cutting</u>. This verge is not yet cut back.

e. <u>Item 1763. injurious weed growth on Clandon Manor farm fields</u>. Mary, assisted by Peter Smart, has completed and returned to DEFRA the relevant forms. There has not yet been an acknowledgement from DEFRA.

f. <u>Item 1764. sycamore along Sawpit Lane</u>. Mary contacted the GBC Tree Officer, but has not yet had any response. It will now need to wait until Spring 2008.

- g. <u>Item 1765 village hall committee</u>. The minutes from the committee are now circulated among councillors, via the clerk. The village hall committee has made no response to the matter of pavement extension, so it is assumed that they have dropped the matter.
- h. Item 1766. police Community Liaison Group. Adrian attended this meeting, together with several villagers. The village is relatively crime free, though the subject of burglary is the one that causes most concern, followed by traffic speeding. Communications between the police and the villagers are now improved because the police are now included on the village email system and can therefore send any information directly. Gill Culmer is also in context as neighbourhood watch representative.
