Because there still has been no response to the letter sent to the believed owner of Clandon Manor Farm (Mr Mark Savage) in July, it was suggested that Mary should contact the Agents responsible for the sale of the property, Sothebys. c. Item 14/075e Tree work in Sawpit Lane. The work will be carried out by South East Tree Surgeons on 23<sup>rd</sup> October. Residents whose properties back on to Sawpit Lane will be notified by Clare Jones (Rendel Cottage). d. Item 14/082 GBC Local Plan. The Local Plan objection was submitted by ECPC to Cllr Stephen Mansbridge, Lead Councillor at Guildford and Lead for Planning. ECPC felt that insufficient attention had been given by GBC on the many poorly thought-through issues which will have a large effect on ST East Clandon and our surrounding parishes. Sibylla has invited Cllr Mansbridge to the village in order for him to hear directly what we and what other surrounding parishes Chairmen feel need to be aired more strongly and to take the discussions on the Local Plan further. Cllr Mansbridge agreed to do so. Sibylla will make arrangements for a date for this meeting. e. Item 14/083 Dog training field. a. Clandon Manor Farm.

Potential purchasers of this property attended the meeting. They told councillors that their considered purchase would be dependent upon receiving planning permission to convert the indoor stables to a covered swimming pool; a planning application will shortly be submitted to GBC. Sibylla informed them of ECPC policy which is likely to be unchanged from previously.

- b. Chris Ross was in attendance at the meeting and made the following requests:
- i. that the grass in the recreation ground be maintained much shorter as the area is used a lot by young families. Sibylla will check with Ray and ask him to tell Jim of the need for more frequent mowing.
- ii. the growth of the trees close to the tennis court may need monitoring.
- iii. he voiced concern about the safety of some of the large trees which
